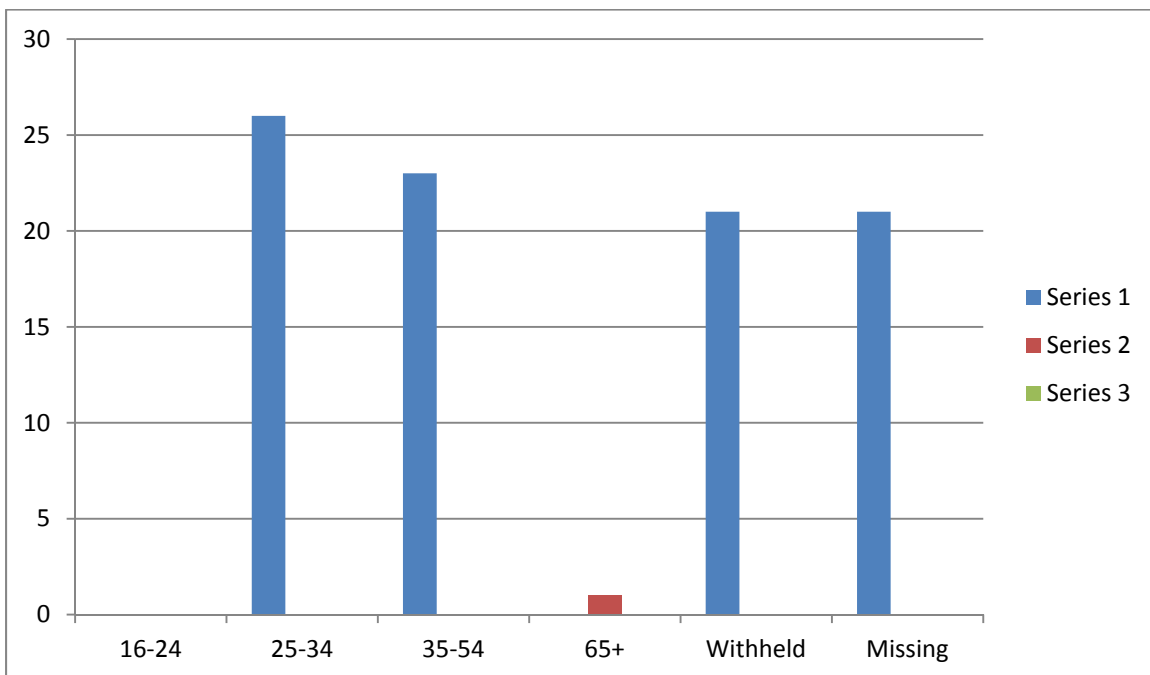


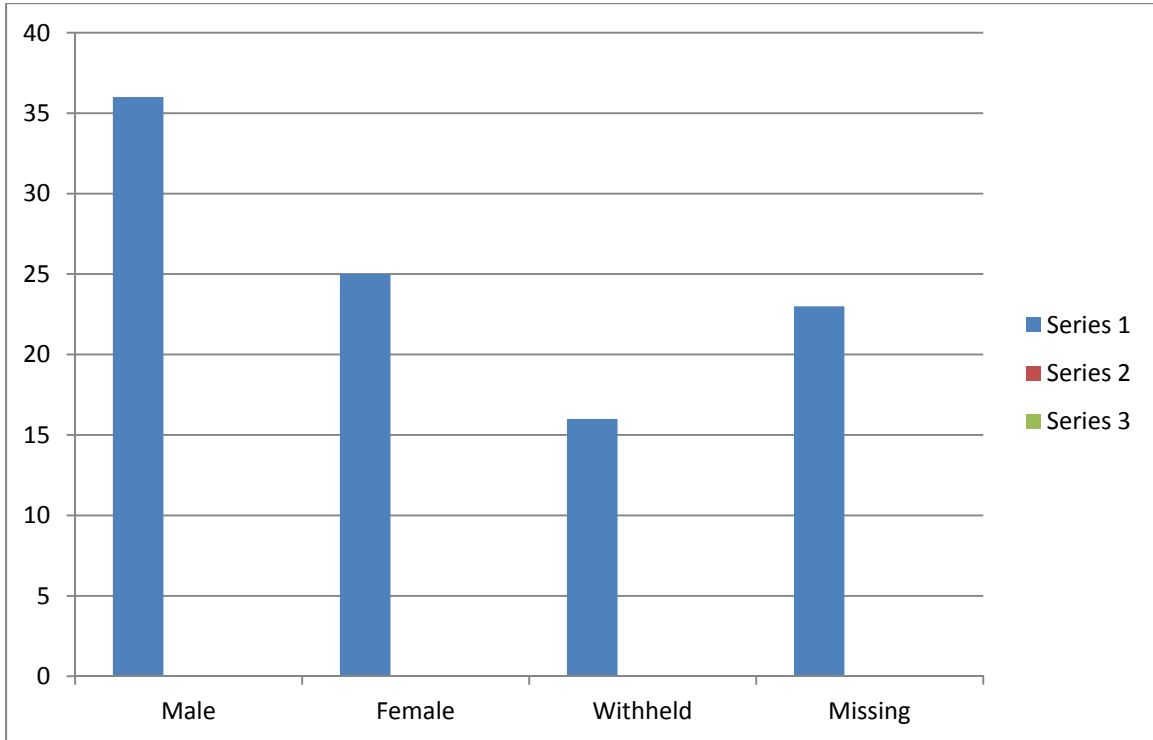
#### **4 KING'S BENCH WALK DIVERSITY DATA**

- The information set out below is an anonymised summary of diversity data collected in a survey of current practising members of chambers (total 61) in December 2012.
- In accordance with government guidance on the approach to be taken by public bodies in publishing their diversity data, information is not being published where those in a particular group are fewer than 10 as this would risk their identification. To this end:
  - Categories are grouped together where appropriate;
  - No data has been published in respect of clerking/administrative staff as there are fewer than 10 individuals in that category;
  - The information below is in respect of all barristers (including QCs and pupils) rather than broken down by seniority
- Within the charts below:
  - All figures are percentages of the total number of current practising members;
  - The term "Withheld" is used to denote members who have indicated they do not wish to provide data and members who have answered "prefer not to say";
  - The term "Missing" is used to denote members who have not replied or who have left an answer to a particular question blank.
  - A red line at 1% is used to indicate where the total for that category is less than 10.

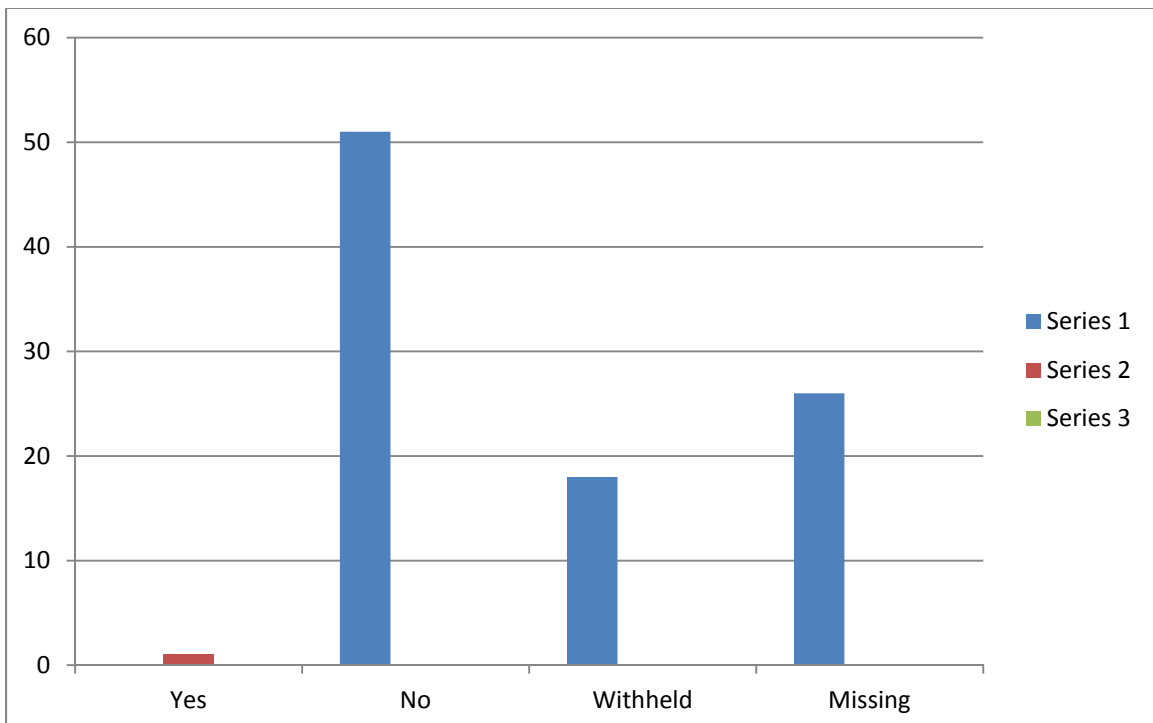
## GENDER



## DISABILITY

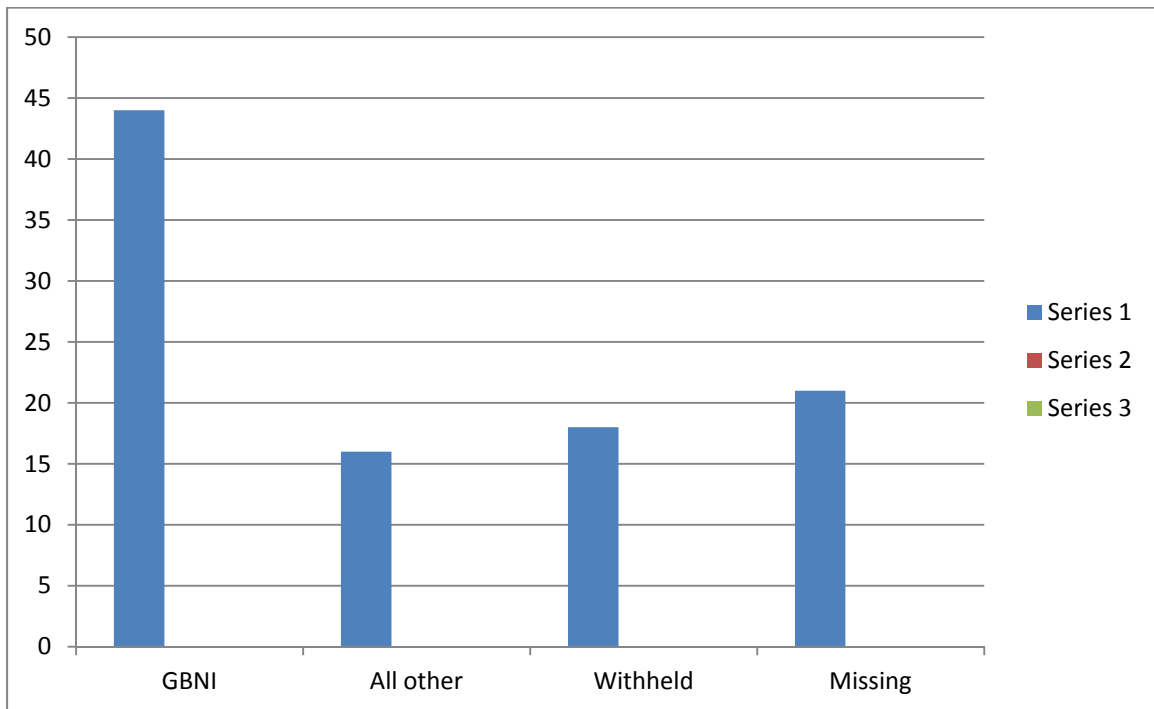
Those members of chambers either:

- Whose day-to-day activities are limited a lot or a little because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or expected to last, at least 12 months.



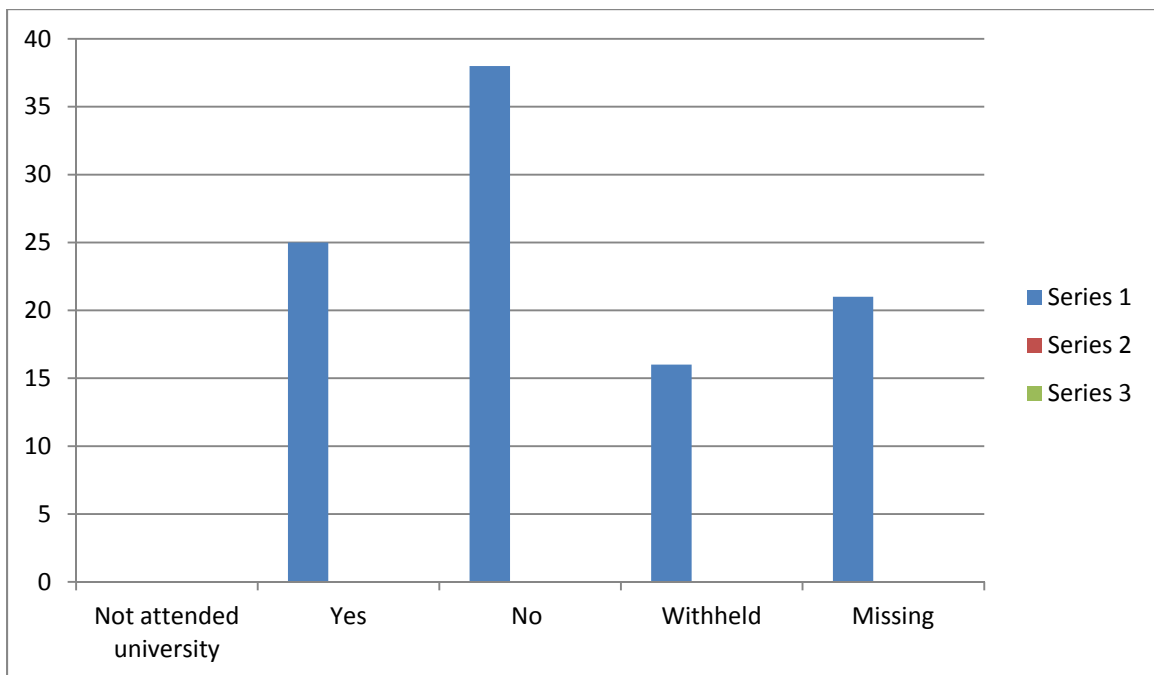
### ETHNIC GROUP

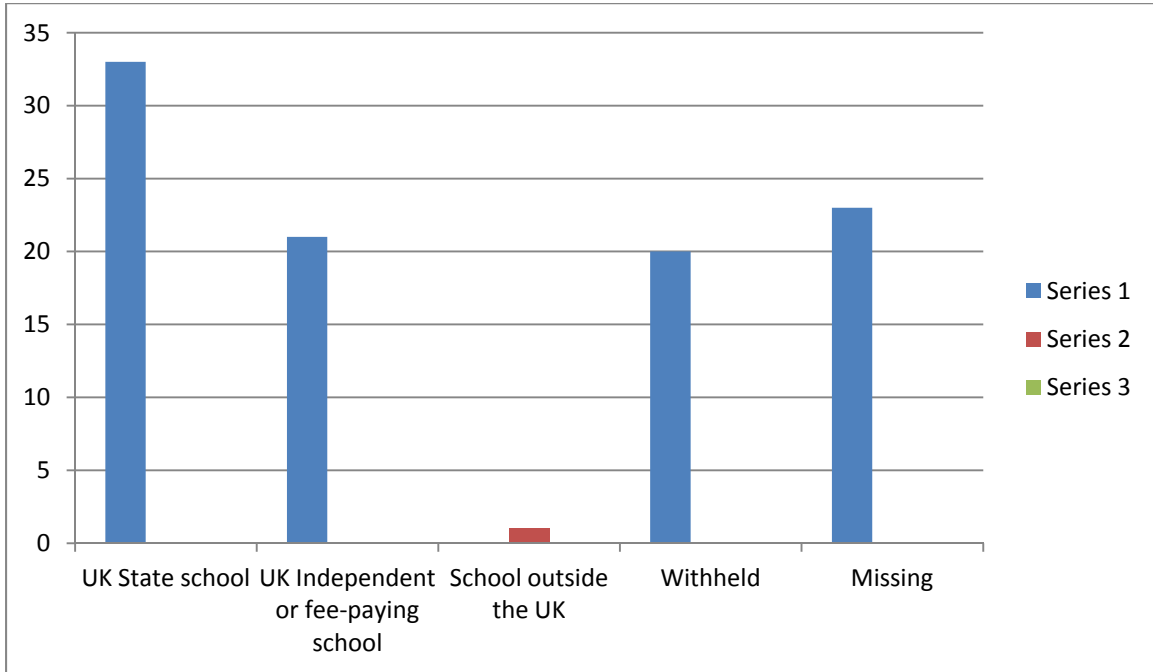
### SOCIO-ECONOMIC GROUP: UNIVERSITY

If members went to University (to study a BA, BSc course or higher), were they part of the first generation of their family to do so?



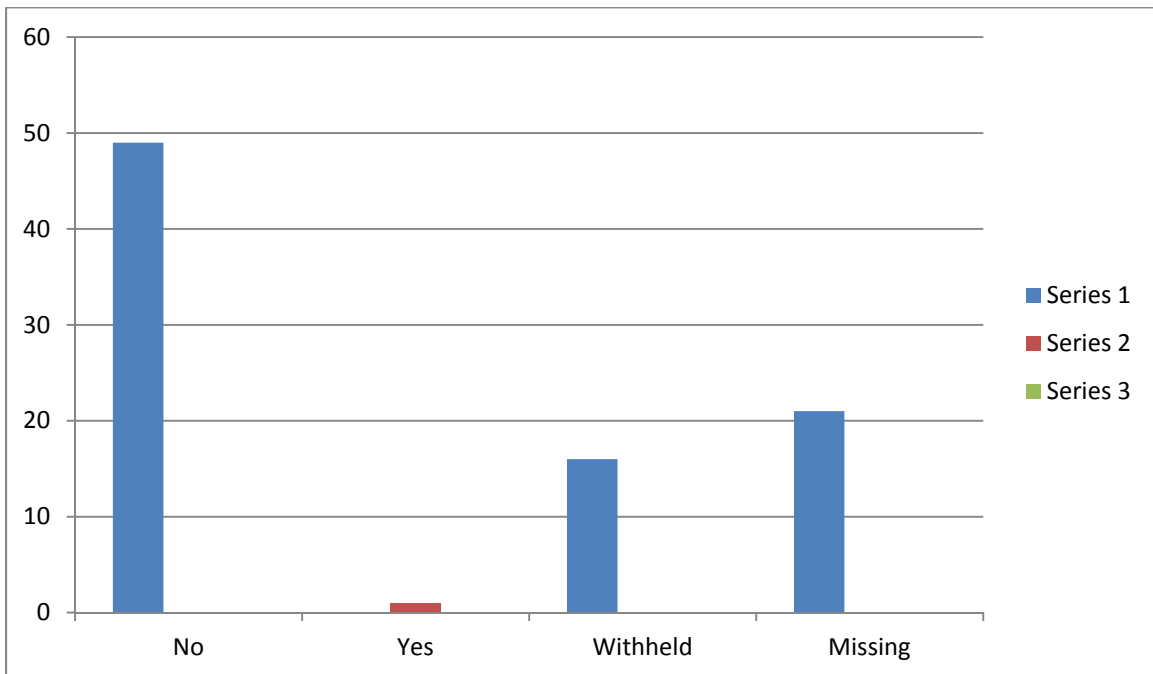
## SOCIO-ECONOMIC GROUP: SECONDARY EDUCATION
